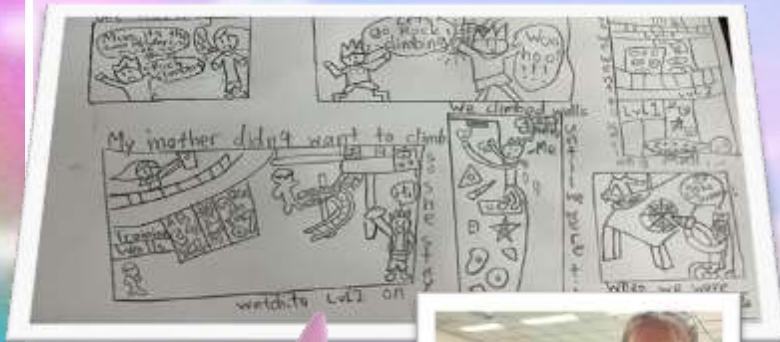


The students worked in groups, making their favourite story characters come alive under the Maker Programme. Using the puppets and props made, they reenacted their favourite stories in class.

In this term's Talent showcase, we have invited Mr Ivan Goh and Mdm Chin Seow Kiat to share with us their love and expertise in professional photography.

Mr Ivan Goh

I gained interest in photography back when I was a teenager. Back then, there was only film photography. I had participated in Photography Competitions such as Canon PhotoMarathon. I got my first digital single-lens reflex (DSLR) camera after a few years of experience and savings. With it, I have taken wedding photography for my friends and several important events shot, including an AIA event.

Usually, after taking the photographs, I do not retouch the photographs as I prefer to set my camera to the desired mode before capturing them. This minimises the need to retouch them after they are taken. In photography, there is no room for mistakes, especially during an event photography. There is no retake; if that moment is lost, it is lost forever.

For those who are interested in exploring photography, my advice for you is to invest in the equipment only after you have established a long term interest in photography. You can also purchase a camera tripod for more balanced shots and be bold in experimenting with your cameras' settings without being afraid of experimenting with different composition.
