Mrs Ong also shared the inspirational story of Ms Yip Pin Xiu, Singapore's Paralympic Gold Medalist, in swimming. Ms Yip, who has muscular dystrophy, clinched Singapore's first ever Paralympic Gold medal in Beijing 2008. She has since gone on to win five Paralympic Gold medals in her career to date. 
Actionbound...

It is a digitally interactive scavenger hunt app which leads the learner on a path of learning and discovery. The team hopes that by getting the teachers to experience how this app was been used in the PD session, they could also explore the possibilities of using this app with their students to enhance teaching and learning.

National Thinker's Challenge (NTC) 2022

Singapore Hokkien Huay Kuan (SHHK) launched the inaugural National Thinker's Challenge (NTC) to encourage students to create innovative solutions by making use of Design Thinking (DT) and Artificial Intelligence (AI) methodologies based on the theme of Climate and Sustainability (Reducing Food Waste).

The response for the competition was overwhelming and it drew a total of 52 participating teams, made up of 238 students from 37 primary schools. Two teams, chosen from the students taking part in the SHHK Thinker's Programme, represented Nan Chiau Primary School in the NTC 2022.

There were phases this Phase 1 -Ideation challenge. In Challenge. The aim was to encourage the curation of innovative ideas using AI methodologies to encourage people to reduce food waste and work towards a Zero Waste Nation by submitting a written proposal on their solution to an identified problem statement.

In Phase 2 - Prototyping and Presentation Challenge. 10 finalists were selected from a total of 52 teams from 37 different schools and were provided with a seed fund to actualise their ideas via modelling and prototyping.

One of the NTC teams from Primary 5 Kindness, comprising of team members Ang Kai Xuan, Chen Yuxuan, Chin Jing Han Ariel and Toh U-Zi, received the Commendation Award.

The finals of the NTC 2022 took place at SHHK Cultural Academy on 11 November and came to a successful conclusion. The Guest-of-Honour for the event was Mr Tan Kiat How, Senior Minister of State, Ministry of Communications and Information & Ministry of National Development.



SHHK Thinkers Programme

Singapore Hokkien Huay Kuan (SHHK) schools collaborated with AI Singapore (AISG) and Singapore Institute Technology (SIT) to organise SHHK Thinkers Programme for selected groups of Primary 5 students.

This programme allows opportunity for the students to explore how technological affordances can improve their way of life so that they can be active contributors to the society and the community through solving authentic real world issues.

Selected teachers and selected group of Primary 5 students underwent training for various modules like Design Thinking and Artificial Intelligence. Teachers guided students in the process of creating the solution via prototyping to a given problem revolving around a theme.

For the SHHK Thinkers Programme 2022, about 30 teachers and 200 students from all five SHHK affiliated schools were involved.

This year, the SHHK Thinkers Programme 2022 Final Showcase was held on Friday, 14 October, at Nan Chiau Primary School.



In this term's Talent Showcase, we have interviewed Mdm Haryani and Mrs Cindy Wong, who will share with us about their passion in music.


Mdm Haryani
