
Sconts and Brownies Founder's Day Celebration

Mr Tan Kah Kee is the founder of Nan Chiau School. He was а great entrepreneur, philanthropist and educator. He was born in Jimei District in Fujian Province of China in 1874. When he was 17, he sailed across the ocean to Singapore to help his father who was doing ricetrading business in Singapore. He had this famous saying... "Money should be treated like fertiliser, to be spread around as much as possible for best effect". It means if someone is rich, he or she should give back to society and make contributions. Mr Tan Kah Kee was affluent but very generous. He used his money on charity and education and founded 'Nan Chiau Teachers' Training College' in 1941. In 1947, Nan Chiau Teachers' Training School was converted by Singapore Hokkien Huay Kuan into Nan Chiau Girls' High School, with an ancillary primary school, with Mr Yang Zhen Li as the first Principal of the school.

To commemorate Mr Tan Kah Kee and his origin, we shared his story using Fujian Zhangzhou puppetry. Ten Primary 4 students from the Bicep class learnt about the traditional Chinese art form of puppetry and put up a thirty minutes video skit depicting the story of Mr Tan Kah Kee.

Mr Tan Kah Kee has this famous saying, "取之社 会, 用之社会". It means 'from the society, for the society'. We invited the students and teachers from Cerebral Palsy Alliance School and Fernvale garden school to join us in celebrating the NC75 anniversary via the online puppetry workshop. A group of prefects hosted the online interactive sessions with them.

Mr Tan Kah Kee believed that education and character building are important. Nan Chiau Primary School focuses on the Moral, Cognitive, Physical, Social and Aesthetic growth of wellrounded students. We strive to practise our school values of 'Perseverance & Sincerity'.

WMS Micro: bit Coding Programme

This year, the Primary 3 students kick started their Watch Me Soar journey by learning about Micro:bit programming. The ten-week programme enables students to learn basic coding and programming skills that would prepare them for today's tech-savvy world. Some of the games that they had learnt to create included Flashing Hearts and Rock Paper Scissor. They also learnt how to turn the Micro:bit into a simple step counter. Each shake event increments a counter variable and the step count is displayed on the Micro:bit LEDs.

Students learnt subtraction using virtual number counters in Mathbot application and showcased their work on Whiteboard.fi. Through the activities, students worked with virtual manipulatives in the form of number counters with place value charts and practised the C-P-A approach in learning how to subtract with regrouping.

Given the opportunities, the students made use of individual devices for learning and gained competency in ICT. They were able to learn with a hands-on approach safely while observing SMM measures. The students looked forward to these math lessons and the learning outcome could be observed in their quality of physical work in the topic of subtraction.



WMS 3-Dimensional (3D) Printing Programme

This term, the students were introduced to three-dimensional (3D) printing during WMS lessons. The students were taught how to use 3D pens all by themselves. They would need to create a two-dimensional object and layer on that object. They would eventually create a 3D entity or create parts that can be joined to form a complete 3D object. Science - Tiger Lilies

students were given The the opportunity to conduct investigations to observe tiger lilies. They practised observation skills to gather information about the different parts of a flower. They asked questions to deepen their understanding and make sense of how reproduction takes place in flowering plants.

Students then compared their observations and communicated their findings in pictorial form. This investigation provided students with an experience which built on their interest and stimulated their curiosity about Life Sciences. In addition, students developed skills and positive habits of mind necessary for scientific inquiry.

FAREWELL TO MR JACKSON KEK

Dear Parents and Students,

In the blink of an eye, three years had gone by. When I first received my posting back in December 2018 to join the Nan Chiau family, I was excited to be part of a legacy. As a Hokkien myself, I was proud to be able to serve in a school that was established by the Singapore Hokkien Huay Kuan. To be able to co-lead an institution with over 75 years of rich history alongside the other school leaders, I prepped myself to give my best. I recalled that on the first day of school, I stood in awe at the morning assembly where I witnessed how disciplined our students were. One of the first things that etched an impression in my mind was the Nan Chiau bow. The respect that students demonstrated inspired me. Over time, I arrived at a conclusion that students performed the Nan Chiau bow not because it was a routine, but the fact that it had become ingrained in them to sincerely respect others.

Over the past three years, as a nation, community and school, we experienced many changes. Disruptions brought about by Covid-19 caused anxiety amongst us. We had to learn to adapt to the changing circumstances, and appreciate whatever we could still enjoy. As a Nan Chiau family, members of the staff, parents, students and other

stakeholders stood together in overcoming all odds.



We partnered one another, never losing sight of the good that could emerge from this crisis. Over time, we learnt to progress alongside this endemic. I observed that our students had grown to be more resilient and they persevered when faced with difficulties. They understood that the world would no longer revolve like how it did in the past, and they were determined to make the best out of every learning moment.

The time has now come for me to move on to other responsibilities. And with a heavy heart, I bid farewell to members of the Nan Chiau family. I will always cherish the smiles, interactions and warmth that I had experienced during my time here. Till the time when our paths cross again, take care and may we continue to soar and fly the Nan Chiau flag high and proud.


